Curriculum/Approach

We work to engage your child's sense of identity by capturing their imagination and attention. We put a lot of effort into providing our students with substantive lessons and a positive atmosphere.

Areas of academic emphasis include:

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Aleph Champ Hebrew Reading Curriculum

Extracurricular

Family days, Shabbat experiences, school contests, hands-on education, and family workshops as well as games, drama, and songs are blended into our curriculum.









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Items to bring weekly:

Tzedakah Kippah for boys Mitzvah note for grades K -4.

Kippah

All boys must bring their own kippah to wear in class. For sanitary reasons, please make sure your child has his own kippah every day. If he forgets his own kippah, he will be given one.

Tzedakah

Tzedakah (charity) is a concept which is basic to Judaism. Parents are asked to provide the students with a daily coin for tzedakah.

Mitzvah Notes (Grades K-4)

A mitzvah is a good deed. We support you to notice the good deeds your child performs and write a mitzvah note to send in weekly with your child. Your child, along with their good deeds will be celebrated in class weekly. An example of a mitzvah note: Max was kind to his brother and shared his new toy.

Snacks

Snacks and water will be provided for all students. PLEASE CONTACT THE OFFICE IF YOUR CHILD HAS ANY FOOD ALLERGIES.

Drop Off/ Pick Up - Drop Off Line opens @ 9:15am

Hebrew School classes meet on Sundays: 9:30-11:30 am. Please ensure that your child arrives on time and is picked up on time in order to get the most out of his/her experience.

Drop-off and pickup is done solely via the carpool line. You can enter our parking lot and join our carpool line outside the building.

Please note, if you are planning to come inside the building, park your car in a designated spot. Do not leave your car in the carpool lane.

Leaving Class Early

If for some significant reason your child has to leave early, you are required to go to the office and sign them out. The secretary will then call your child who will come up. This is a safety precaution to protect your children. No child will be allowed to linger in the hallways or wait outside

Attendance

Regular attendance is crucial to your child's success in Hebrew school. There is a direct correlation between attendance and achievement, interest and attitude. Furthermore, coming late disturbs the entire class and disrupts your child's classroom routine. Adhering to the attendance policy will be greatly appreciated and will help your child get the most out of Hebrew school.

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Family Involvement

Parents are an integral part of our program. We host many opportunities for parents to participate and grow along with their child in their Hebrew School journey. We offer family days, parent breakfasts', Friday night dinners, an active PTA, family workshops, and a myriad of other family programs throughout the year.

Security

The Chai Center takes the safety of our students and families seriously. Our Hebrew School students are protected by a professional armed security guard to ensure maximum safety. The main entrance is the only egress used during Hebrew School times.

Homework

Limited homework may be assigned. Homework will consist of a review and reinforcement of Hebrew reading.

Communication

We believe in a strong parent/teacher partnership. Communication helps support a meaningful and pleasant Hebrew School experience for your child. Your child's happiness is our top priority.

We will be sending out weekly emails notifying you of upcoming events, important notices, and what your child has covered in class each week.

Health and Wellness

Please inform us of any important factors in your child's health, such as allergies, vision, hearing, medications, an IEP or specific learning needs. This will help us to be understanding and cater to his/her needs. Of course, the greatest care will be taken to maintain the confidentiality of the student/family.

Contagious Illness: Please notify us in the event of a contagious illness so that we may notify the parents of other children in the class to be aware of the symptoms.

We have a trained staff member certified in CPR/First Aid on duty at all times.

In case of minor injury, the first aider will treat the injury. For major injuries, G-d forbid, EMS will be called as well as the parents. In the event the parents/guardians cannot be reached, the emergency contact on file will be contacted. If necessary, the child will be taken to the nearest hospital.

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Helping Your Child Succeed

In order for our program to be most effective, the following are a few suggestions:

- Many of our students are involved in other extracurricular activities, i.e. sports, music lessons, etc. All these are important; however, please place priority on your child's Jewish education.
- Participation in Synagogue services and celebration of Jewish Holidays will greatly enhance your child's interest in Judaism and strengthen his/her Jewish identity. We invite all Hebrew School families to join us for Shabbat and holiday services and programs.
- Show your child that you are interested in his/her Jewish education. Make a habit of asking your child/ren how their day was, and what they have learned. This will greatly encourage and help foster a strong Jewish identity and positive attitude.

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
